Even though we explained over and over that this was a lake, Asher could not get past how big it was and how wide and seemingly deep it must be.

On the other hand, Kaylynn knew it was a lake. She knew it was fresh water. She knew where it was located in the United States and she even knew some of what the vessels on this lake looked like.

We had been to lakes before:

Lake Carl Blackwell, Grand Lake, Beaver Lake, Boomer Lake. They were all lakes and so she had a grasp of what a lake was like in her mind.

The amazing thing was to watch Kaylynn be confronted with the reality of a lake this large. Even with all her knowledge, until she was presented with a lake that had no opposite shore and no knowable depth, she couldn't conceive of it.

The Love of God is much like Lake Michigan.

To many, it seems like it must be something else or something that has a hitch. There is no way in their minds that love could be so vast and so intimate.

To others, they have a grasp on what love should be after seeing it in the world, but upon coming in contact with the true love of Christ they are flummoxed by the grace that covers this passion and intimacy that has no end.

The Ladies' Bible Studies continued meeting and the Saturday morning group finished up their study. The Wednesday group finished up in the first week of August.


We held services at the Hennessey Nursing Home with several more than usual helping out. Jimmy led the singing, Beth played the piano and Fred gave the devotional.
